Notice of Lower Empire Grade Shaded Fuel Break <u>Pile Burning Operation</u>

FELTON – On Tuesday, April 16, weather-permitting, CAL FIRE CZU firefighters will work to improve the Lower Empire Grade Shaded Fuel Break by burning an estimated 60-piles of vegetation across 8acres. CAL FIRE CZU established this fuel break on the west side of Empire Grade several years ago to reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfire to the area, improve ingress and egress for the community of Bonny Doon, and to help protect University of California, Santa Cruz infrastructure. Firefighters can also use this maintained shaded fuel break to take a stand against oncoming wildfire, if necessary.

NOTE: This pile burn will be done in accordance with all the rules and regulations of the local air quality district, Monterey Bay Air Resources District (MBARD) to make sure there are no impacts to the local community. Burning pre-arranged, dry piles of vegetation produces much less smoke than heavy fuels in large broadcast burns. Pile burning also allows for easy control of smoke production. Forester Brett Agler says, "It is important to continue work on fuel breaks as the vegetation never stops growing. It is easier to maintain a fuel break once it is established. However, if it is not maintained, it will no longer function as a fuel break." Please see the map on Page 2 for more information on the treated area.



This prescribed fire was planned as part of broader strategic efforts to protect the local community and nearby natural resources. These plans are informed by community and local stakeholder input and serve as a collaborative effort with a range of cooperators throughout the course of the project.
